Medical/dental supplies school supplies and more than 150 handmade quilts from sponsoring churches were distributed and contact was made with 2 children's shelters. An after school program for needy children was established in Osipovichi. About 10 children will be provided a warm safe place for up to 6 hours each weekday. Children will be served a meal and snacks, and offered homework and English tutoring. - Funds donated in the amount of \$2,000 to the Special School for the purpose of upgrading the firm alarm system and general maintenance. - Second Annual Blessing of the Fleet on Lake Norman established as a fundraiser. Almost 100 boats participated. \$3,200 was raised to help offset the cost of travel and insurance for children participating in the summer program. - \$1,000 grant awarded to the South Iredell Health Assistance Clinic to the benefit of needy children in the local community.
